



Kearsley Public School established in 1912, is on the lands of the Wonnarua, Darkinjung and Awabakal people. The school fosters a culture of high expectations and respect. KPS is a place that ensures social equity and success through explicit and responsive instruction based on the Science of Learning, so that every student reaches their maximum potential.

There is a strong focus on our values of respect, responsibility and learning and Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is an integrated part of the school. Learning and wellbeing is underpinned by a Response to Intervention model aimed at early identification and support of students' academic and behaviour needs. The school provides students with high levels of access to technology and a range of cultural, creative, sporting and leadership opportunities. The teaching staff is a mix of experienced and early career teachers who value teamwork and are committed to implementing evidence informed practices that are responsive to student needs.






TEACHING AND LEARNING

We use the evidence informed approach of explicit instruction in English and Mathematics lessons. Explicit instruction is a very efficient strategy for helping students learn because it suits how the brain processes, stores, and retrieves information. It includes retrieving and reviewing, breaking down new learning into smaller steps, modelling, guiding, practising and giving multiple opportunities to take new learning to mastery.

There are six Key Learning Areas (KLA's) in primary school.



HISTORY AND GEOGRAPHY

Students learn about history, geography, civics and citizenship.

They will investigate their personal community identity and gain an understanding of their nation and its place in the world.

Students will learn to participate effectively in maintaining and improving the quality of their society and environment.

SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY

This subject develops student skills in thinking, problem solving and investigating.

Students will develop knowledge and skills in scientific investigation, design and applied technology.

CREATIVE ARTS

Students will experience visual arts, music, drama and dance. They will have opportunities to explore their own creativity in each of these areas.

Students will learn and perform drama and dance and will express themselves through visual arts and music.

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT, HEALTH & PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Students will develop skills, knowledge and the attitudes they require to lead healthy, active and fulfilling lives.

They will learn how their bodies change and grow over time.

Students learn the importance of a healthy lifestyle that encompasses good food and regular exercise.

The syllabuses for the Key Learning Areas work students through stages and students work towards achieving Syllabus Outcomes appropriate to their ability and age/stage of development.

Most children will achieve the outcomes for the Stages as follows:

Early Stage 1 - Kindergarten Stage 1 - Years 1 & 2 Stage 2 - Years 3 & 4 Stage 3 - Years 5 & 6 Assessments are ongoing and are at individual, class, grade, school and state levels. These assessments inform teaching and/or measure growth and achievement. Written reports are provided at the end of Terms 2 and 4. Parent/teacher interviews are encouraged, scheduled at set times and available by appointment at any time.

Technology

Our computer network and technology are constantly being upgraded. Each student has a device and we follow a Digital Scope and Sequence to ensure safe and effective technology integration across all learning. Each classroom has an interactive smart board to support learning. Cessnock Academy of STEM Excellence (CASE) is an initiative of the Cessnock High School Learning Community As a result, we have a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Maths) teacher once a fortnight and skills students learn are integrated across their learning. We are also part of the Film By the Vines Festival as part of the Cessnock Community of Great Public Schools.


Learning Support

We prioritise reading at Kearsley Public School. The school invests heavily in the library to ensure all students have explicit library lessons and access to quality books. Classes will be allocated a borrowing day at the start of every year. The library is open second lunch break for students as well.



LEADERSHIP

Our school has two School Captains and two Vice-Captains as our school leaders. We also have a House Captain and Vice-Captain leading each sporting house.

The Student Representative Council (SRC) is a group of students in the school, elected by and from their fellow students for a semester each year. They organise fundraising activities, make suggestions and run activities.

Each year our Kuluwayn Team elects a President, Vice-President, Secretary and Events Co-ordinator who are voted in by the team. This process is supported by the President of the AECG. (Aboriginal Education Consultative Group)

COMMUNITY AND EVENTS

Parents and families are an integral part of Kearsley Public School. Helpful ways to engage in your child's education and partner with the school include:

- Communicating regularly with teachers and staff
- Discussing with your child what they are learning at school
- Reading the fortnightly Newsletter and School Bytes messages
- Respectfully sharing compliments, feedback or suggestions directly with the school
- Ensuring your child attends school every day they are well
- Setting up good routines for your children, such as:
 - o getting ready for school and being on time
 - wearing proper school uniform
 - going to bed at a reasonable time
 - daily reading
 - bringing home notes

The school actively encourages parent involvement in school activities.

- Sharing your talents and interests
- Assisting the P&C
- Assisting in the canteen

Any assistance you may be able to provide is always appreciated. Volunteers may be required to complete a WWCC check. Please contact the Office for more information. All volunteers must sign in and out at the Office.

PARENTS & CITIZENS ASSOCIATION

The P & C meets at 3:30pm, on the first Thursday of each month to organise fundraising activities, run the canteen and discuss education and school happenings. Membership is open to all parents and interested citizens at a cost of \$2.00. Should you wish to be part of this energetic and vibrant committee, please come along.

SPECIAL DAYS

Each year our school celebrates a range of special events. We hold an Easter Hat Parade, Book Parade,

a Mother's Day Morning Tea, Education Week events, open classrooms, Father's Day/Blokes Breakfast as well as Grandparents Day. Our P&C hold Mother's Day and Father's Day stalls where our students can purchase gifts for a small cost.

ASSEMBLIES

These are held on even weeks on a Friday at 2:30 in our school hall. Classes take turns to present/perform and awards are given.



Aboriginal Education Consultative Group (AECG)

The primary role of the NSW AECG Inc. is to promote active participation by Aboriginal people in the consultative and decision-making process of education and training related matters.

The AECG meets monthly.

<u>Attendance</u>

Regular attendance and punctuality at school are legal requirements and so important for learning and wellbeing.

If a child is absent from school an absence needs to be explained. Preferably this will be done via School Bytes. Absences can also be explained by ringing the office.

All students should be in attendance by 9.05am. Students who are late and arrive after this time, must report to the school office for a late note. A record of lateness is kept. Early leave is only granted in exceptional circumstances. Early leave must go through the office.

Appointments should, wherever possible, be made out of school hours. Planned absences from school for a period of more than 5 days require approval from the principal. The appropriate form is the Extended Leave Form on School Bytes or please ask for a copy at the school office.

All attendance is monitored daily and poor attendance will be followed up with parents and possibly with the Home School Liaison Officer – in accordance with Department policy.

Bikes, Buses, Scooters

Bike racks are provided for bikes or scooters.

Students walk their bikes/scooters into school grounds. By law, students who ride their bicycles and scooters must wear a helmet.

Travel passes are available for the bus for all K - 2 children if required. However, once a child progresses to Year 3 they are only available if a child lives more than 1.6 kilometres from the school. Applications are completed online – you can pick up a brochure from the office.

Counsellor

The school counsellor attends the school one day each fortnight and supports teaching, learning and welfare programs through educational testing, counselling, referrals and advice. The counsellor works with students, parents or carers and teachers in a variety of ways.

Book Club

The school participates in the Scholastic Book Club Scheme. Students are able to purchase quality books at a very reasonable price through the school.



<u>Canteen</u>

Open Monday, Tuesday & Thursday from 8.30am to 12.00pm.

Lunch orders must be made before 9.05am and ideally in a Lunch Bag purchased for \$10.

Children may purchase snacks at lunchtime.

Our menu is available on School Bytes and we follow the NSW Healthy School Canteen Strategy.

<u>Equipment</u>

All items should (wherever possible) be clearly marked with the child's name.

Years 5 - 6

Small pencil case with blue/red ball point pens, HB lead pencils, coloured pencils, textas, scissors, glue stick, eraser, sharpener, homework book, and ideally a Canteen Lunch Bag.

Years 3 - 4

Small pencil case with HB lead pencils, coloured pencils, textas, scissors, glue stick, eraser, sharpener, homework book, library bag, and ideally a Canteen Lunch Bag.

Years 1 - 2

Small pencil case with HB lead pencils, coloured pencils, glue stick, eraser, sharpener, homework book, library bag and ideally a Canteen Lunch Bag.

Kindergarten

Wireless/Bluetooth headphones valued approximately \$20 and ideally a Canteen Lunch Bag.

Optional- Wireless/Bluetooth headphones valued approximately \$20 for all students.

 Throughout the year excursions are undertaken in conjunction with class studies. They complement the learning taking place in the classroom. They may also be for sporting activities. Prices are kept to a minimum with the school and/or P&C often contributing Financial assistance forms are available at the office – all requests are kept strictly confidential. Relevant information and costing is given well in advance. Part payments are available for more expensive excursions. Planned transition opportunities support a strong start to Year 7.	 Please contact the office if your child has a specific health or medication need, so we can support and explain the department process. Contagious Diseases - Children must stay away from school for the following conditions. Chicken pox - At least five days after first spots appear or at least until blisters have all crusted. Conjunctivitis - While there's a discharge from the eye. Gastroenteritis/Vomiting -At least 24 hours after diarrhoea or vomiting stops. German Measles - Four days after rash appears. Hepatitis A - Two weeks after first symptoms or one week after onset of jaundice. 		
	 Impetigo (School Sores) - Until treatment starts, sores should be covered by a watertight dressing. Measles - Five days after rash appears. Mumps - Nine days after swelling occurs. Head Lice - Until the head is treated with anti Lice treatment Hand, Foot & Mouth - Until all blisters have dried. May return to school if sores are covered. Whooping Cough - 3 weeks from the onset of the whoop. All the above rules are made by the NSW Health Department. 		

<u>Kuluwayn</u>	Personal Possessions		
Aboriginal students have the opportunity to become a part of the Kuluwayn Education team. They meet once a fortnight to learn together and make decisions relating to Aboriginal education at Kearsley PS.	Items NOT to be brought to school include: iPods, hand-held games, large toys, valuable toys, knives or weapons of any kind, water pistols, water bombs, chewing gum, and make up Labels - All clothing, school bags, lunch boxes, drink bottles and all removable items should be clearly labelled with child's name and class. Clearly marked items are easily able to be returned. SO PLEASE CLEARLY MARK ALL ITEMS. Jewellery - Should not be worn at school, except for studs if a child has pierced ears. The school cannot be responsible for the loss of expensive jewellery. Dangling earrings should not be worn, as accidents can occur. Mobile phones - Students are mot encouraged to bring phones as they may always use the school phone to contact parents if needed.



DROP OFFS AND PICK UPS



Ideally, the best place to pick up of an afternoon is from Tomalpin Street (bus gate) which is the safest, as Allandale Street is very busy.

Allandale St (library gate) is great for a quick drop off and pick up, as there is a Kiss and Drop zone and often a staff member is there in the morning, but if you like to get out of your car and also chat to other families, then Tomalpin St is the safest.

The crossing on Caledonia Street (front gate) is manned each morning and afternoon.
