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From The Principal's Desk

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Kullaburra Awards

NAPLAN Results

Congratulations to the Years 3 & 5 students who received their NAPLAN results yesterday. It was good to see the Year 3 students close the gap on the state average in reading and Year 5 students were above the state average for growth between Year 3 and 5 in reading. The NAPLAN results will also assist the teachers develop strategies to improve areas where our students need extra assistance.

Live Life Well

This term the school has started a new program aimed at improving students awareness of healthy eating and being active. To assist this program we are adjusting the school lunch times so teachers are able to discuss with the children healthy eating choices. Starting Monday, the lunch bell will ring at 11:00 and the teachers will stay with their class for 10 minutes. The end of lunch bell will ring at 12:00 noon. Parents are reminded that the school encourages students to drink plenty of water, eating healthy options and be active as part of their daily education. Students need their sun safe hat every day.

Discipline Policy

Last week I spoke to all students about their manners and the way they spoke to teachers and their peers. My main focus is that we want to stamp out swearing and rude hand and body gestures. Swearing at a teacher will be an immediate Red Card. Swearing heard by the teacher towards others will be an Amber or Red depending on the severity and intent. Rude hand or body language seen or reported to the teacher will be an Amber card. All this information is then kept on the school system. I encourage parents to talk to their children about the way they communicate with their peers and teachers.

Intensive Swimming Program, 28 October—8 November

Kearsley Public School will be participating in the Learn to Swim Program provided by the Department of Education. 


Abernethy BioDiversity Bash


