PBL (Positive Behaviour for Learning)

This year in PBL (Positive Behaviour for Learning) we have made a few adjustments to the program. Firstly Kookaburra Cards are now colour coded to correspond to each term. For example Term 1 is blue, Term 2 is green, Term 3 is pink and Term 4 is yellow. The reward structure is now 3 awards = ice block or pencil, 5 awards = lucky dip and 7 awards = canteen voucher. Over the course of the year each term tally is collated. Students can achieve Bronze level (10 awards), Silver level (15 awards) and Gold level (20 awards).

P&C Meetings 2014

Meetings are held the first Thursday of each month at 2pm in the school library. We would like to extend a special invitation to our new families to the school who may wish to join the P&C to attend. The first P&C meeting was held today, the next meeting will be Thurs 6 March.

FREE Childhood Obesity Program for Local Families

Dear Parent/Carer,

I am writing to let you know about a **FREE** healthy lifestyle program for families of children aged 7-13 who are above their healthy weight. The program is called Go4Fun! With an emphasis on practical, fun learning, the program is designed to deliver sustained improvements in families' diets, fitness levels and overall health.

The program runs for 10 weeks over the school term and is delivered once or twice a week for two hours - the first hour consisting of interactive discussions and activities about nutrition and behaviour change and the second hour alternating between land and water based games and activities. Go4Fun encourages a family approach and as such a parent or carer must attend all sessions with the child. Go4Fun is completely **FREE** for children and families to attend and the sessions are run after school. Go4Fun is not a diet and does not encourage rapid weight loss in children, rather it is about empowerment – working with the child and family in a range of ways to make healthy lifestyle changes in terms of physical activity, food, self-confidence and personal development. By following the Go4Fun principles, participants will lose weight naturally and thereby build a foundation for healthy living – for life.


