Spelling Mastery & Maths Plus

Students will be involved in Spelling Mastery during Literacy time again this year. Spelling Mastery is a six-level spelling series designed primarily for students in grades 1 through 6. Placement Test results determine the level appropriate for each student. Spelling Mastery uses specific strategies that encourage students to think their way through spelling rather than to memorise weekly spelling lists. Student work books will be paid for by the school again this year.

Students will be involved in using Maths Plus resources during Mathematics time this year. All students will be working at grade level with homework based on what has been taught in the classroom.

School Swimming Carnival 2016

Our school swimming carnival has been booked for Friday 12 February 2016. Full details and notes have been sent home with students. Permission notes need to be returned to class teachers by **tomorrow**. Payment is to be made to Mrs Graham upon entry to the pool. Students from Yr 2 who turn 8 in 2016 and all primary children will attend. Students are to be dropped directly to and picked up from the pool. Parents are invited to attend, hope to see you all there!

General Permission Notes

A general permission note was sent home today. It gives students permission to use the internet, permission for walking excursions, permission to have photos taken at school etc. A separate permission note will need to be filled out for each child. Please initial each one and sign at the bottom and return to your class teacher by Friday 19 Feb.

Prohibited Employment Declaration

All parents/carers who volunteer in any capacity (reading groups, canteen, P&C, driving students to and from sporting/excursions etc.) at Kearsley Public School will need to fill out a prohibited employment declaration form. These can be collected at the office or we can send one home with your child. A new form needs to be done each year, so if you filled one in last year a new one will need to be done for this year, thank you. Parents who are transporting students to extra curricula activities will also need to provide the office with drivers licence and car insurance details. Thank you for your ongoing support of our students.

Student Bus Passes

As you may have seen on recent media releases, the NSW Government Transport Department is introducing Opal Cards for student travel. This will be replacing the current system of bus, train and ferry passes. All parents or carers of students entering **Kindergarten, Year 3 and Year 7 in 2016** are now required to apply online for their School Travel Pass. The recent bus pass applications you have completed have now been made obsolete.

How to apply:

Step 1. Complete the application at transportnsw.info/school-students

Step 2. Print, sign and date the completed application, then bring it to the school for endorsement by 11th December 2015.

Step 3. The school will then endorse the application and forward it to Transport for NSW. Once approved, the school Opal Card will be sent to the address provided on the application.

We received all of our 2016 passes and these were sent home with students this week. For those who didn't receive a pass and need one please follow the above instructions to apply for a new one which will then be mailed to the students home address.

Voluntary School Contributions 2015

PACKING A HEALTHY LUNCHBOX

Many products marketed as being a healthy lunchbox addition can be high in sugar and fat, and low in nutrients. Here are some healthy options to consider swapping in your child's lunchbox:

- An apple or banana instead of a fruit roll-up.
- Swap chips for unsalted air-popped popcorn.
- Include low-fat plain milk instead of drinks high in sugar such as sports drinks and fruit drinks with less than 99% juice.
- Swap sugary snacks, such as cake or biscuits, for a low-fat plain/fruit-based yoghurt.
- Use wholemeal or multi-grain bread instead of white bread for sandwiches.

Getting started with School Banking.

How it works

The School Banking program provides children with an opportunity to make deposits into their Youthsaver account at school each week. The program is about how often your child makes deposits, not how much they deposit.


Students will receive a yellow Dollarsmites wallet and deposit book to bring their money to school. Every deposit, regardless of amount, earns them a silver Dollarsmites token. Once they've collected 10 tokens they can redeem them for a reward. You'll find a list of reward items on the enclosed Rewards Card. Please note, students are not allowed to pool their tokens with other students or siblings.

Setting up a Youthsaver account

To get your child started on their savings adventure, you'll need to set them up with a Youthsaver account. This is a savings account that has no monthly account fees or withdrawal fees when you use CommBank ATMs and branches, and offers a competitive bonus interest rate.

You can do this in one of three ways:

- Online (existing customers only)**
If you're an existing Commonwealth Bank customer, log in to netbank.com.au, go to the Offers and Apply tab, select Accounts, then scroll down to Youthsaver Account and click Find out more. From there, click Open now to apply. Please have your child's birth certificate on hand for ID purposes.
- In branch**
Visit any Commonwealth Bank branch to set up an account. Please bring identification for you and your child, like your driver's licence and child's birth certificate.
- Application form**
Download the "Youthsaver account application" form from commbank.com.au/schoolbanking. Complete in full, including the identification requirements. Then hand it in to your School Banking Co-ordinator on School Banking day or during an Account opening day held at your school. Please note, paper-based Youthsaver account openings may take up to 10 days once the form has been received.



STUDENT SCHOOL BANKING

Thursdays is KPS's student banking day. Please bring your passbooks in and give them to the teacher in the morning so she can put them in the special grey satchel for your class. You will get a silver token each time you bank and at the end of term there will be a BANKING REWARDS DAY where you nominate your reward and "pay" for it with 10 silver tokens. Put these silver tokens in a safe place at home until this newsletter lets you know a rewards day is coming. PS Each bank day afternoon don't forget to ask your teacher to get your bank passbook out again so you can take it home.
