

Athletics Carnival Wrap -Up by Mrs Singleton

On the 6th of May Kearsley Public school students arrived at Turner Park for our Annual Athletics Carnival. Mother nature delivered a bright and beautiful day turning on the sun and blue sky. It was great to see many families arrive throughout the day to cheer students on. The day started with the 800m, followed by a pre-schoolers race and then age races. Students had a small break followed then by our field events. Kindergarten, Year 1 and some Year 2 students thoroughly enjoyed a mixed sports rotation out in the centre of the field. Activities included egg and spoon races, foam javelin throwing, sack races and hula hooping. Primary students rotated through discus, shot putt, 200m race and long jump, with a lunch break in their age group. Student behaviour, participation and sportsmanship were excellent and the day was thoroughly enjoyed by all students, staff, parents and community. Thank you to the P&C for supplying ice cold drinks, tea, coffee and yummy slices and also our local Little Athletics organisation for the use of equipment on the day. Ribbons and age champions will be presented at our weekly assembly on Friday May 27th 2016. Cross Country ribbons will be handed out at assembly this Friday May 13 to the first three place getters.

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
