Cross Country Colour Run

Tomorrow our school will be holding a cross country colour run for all Yrs. 3-6 children and those students in Year 2 that turn 8 this year. This will enable us to pick our team for the Zone Cross Country. The race will be at Jeffery Park, Kearsley. We will be walking from school at 9.15am. The race will start at approx. 9.30am and we will be returning to school by lunchtime. This year students will run as normal but are invited to wear a white t-shirt or clothing that can be sprayed with coloured water. At each checkpoint staff and parent helpers will be armed with water coloured with food dye. Students will be only sprayed on the shirt.

Please ensure your child is wearing clothing that may be sprayed with coloured water, joggers and a hat. 


Voluntary School Contributions 2018

Try Yulunga: Traditional Indigenous Games

Taktyerra - The activity is named after the word 'to fight' (taktyerrain) in the Wembawemba language of Victoria.



Two players stand on small mats (2m²) facing each other about 4m apart.
Players have a soft ball in each hand and attempt to hit their opponent without being hit themselves.

Players may move around on the mats: dodge, jump, bend or fall to avoid being hit, but must remain on the mat

Tell Them From Me Survey

I am delighted that this term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the Tell Them From Me student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used Tell Them From Me to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 12 March and 13 April. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.
