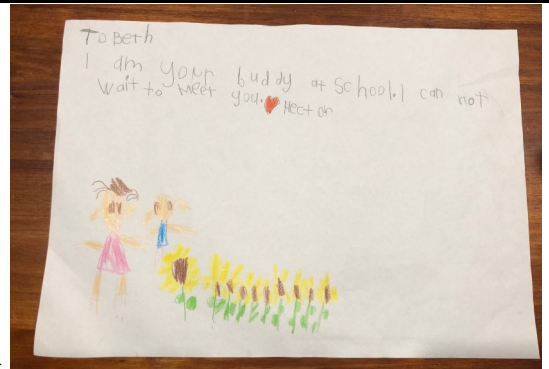

Sydney Excursion

Years 3 & 4 have the opportunity to participate in an overnight excursion to Sydney on Thursday 7 November – Friday 8 November 2019. This is an exciting, fun-packed experience for all students. The cost will be \$120 which includes return coach transport, opal card for ferry trip, accommodation, meals at Cockatoo Island, recess and lunch on day 2 and all activities.

Students who expressed an interest in the overnight excursion are asked to begin paying for the trip. The balance of \$80 may be paid now, or in weekly instalments or in 2 instalments as follows:

Instalment 1—\$40 due by Friday 18 October 2019

Final Instalment—\$40 due by Friday 1 November 2019

Thanks must be given to the P and C who have kindly donated \$1500 to cover the cost of the bus for all students. This has considerably reduced the cost of the excursion.

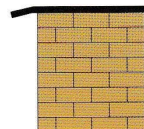
