Canberra Excursion Update

Our Canberra excursion has been locked in for Week 1, Term 4—Wednesday 16 October until Friday 18 October.

It is anticipated the next Canberra excursion will take place again in 2027 when our current Year 1—3 students are in Year's 4—6. A School Bytes permission note has been emailed to all families with costs. The full cost of this excursion is \$495. The P&C have very generously donated \$50 per student, the Government has a PACER rebate of \$45 per student and the school will pay \$30 per student. THE TOTAL COST TO FAMILIES IS \$370. This can be paid off in instalments and at any amount you wish provided it is PAID IN FULL BY FRIDAY 4 OCTOBER 2024. Parents can also start paying off smaller amounts each week if they wish.

Arriving at school and class on time:


- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.








